

ECONOMICS MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

All Economics major requirements must be taken for a letter grade with a minimum grade of C-. At least 18 hours of Economics courses must be completed at the U of U. The Economics major consists of (1) the Core, (2) Economics Focus Areas (3) Economics Electives, and (4) Allied coursework. A 2.0 Econ GPA is required for graduation.

Minimum Major Hours: 48 (36 Econ plus 12 Allied)
